This lovely handmade 'Hadithi' basket was made by local Kenyan women from the Kasigau Corridor – an area of stunning wildlife but with harsh agricultural conditions due to the lack of rain.

The baskets provide the women with an alternative source of income. 'Hadithi' means 'a story' in Swahili.

Because each product sold holds the story of the woman who made that product. The women make beautiful handmade baskets that give them hope of a brighter future.

SOCIO ECONOMIC

The sale of baskets made out of locally grown sisal – from the Kasigau region in Kenya – has become an important sustainable and ecological source of income. 75 groups of women – with more or less twenty members per group – are involved in the production of these wonderful Hadithi baskets. The limited rainfall in these areas often leads to failed crops and therefore a loss of income. To earn a secure income, locals hunt animals, cut down forests and sell charcoal. These acts have devastating environmental effects, but an alternative source of income is essential! The Hadithi project offers that alternative.
